In her latest book, *Grand Pursuit: A History of Economic Genius*, she takes on one of the greatest inventions of modern time—economics.

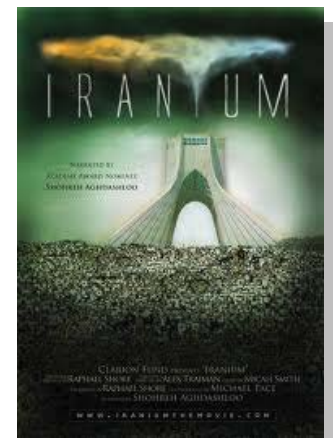


Iranium

Finding a Lost Tribe of Israel: The Bnei Menashe of India

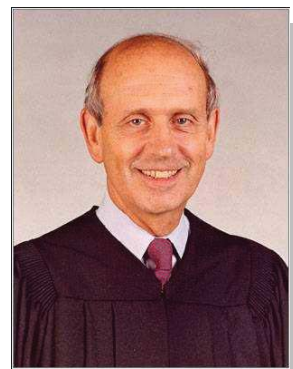
Hear members of the Bnei Menashe community, along with Shavei Israel founder Michael Freund, tell the remarkable story of how this lost tribe is finally coming home. The Bnei Menashe (Hebrew for “sons of Manasseh”) of northeast India trace their roots to the ancient Israelite tribe of Menashe, one of the Ten Lost Tribes exiled by the Assyrian empire more than twenty-seven centuries ago. Despite being cut off from the rest of the Jewish people for generations, they clung to their identity. Michael Freund is the founder and chairman of Shavei Israel, a Jerusalem-based organization that reaches out and assists “lost Jews” seeking to strengthen their connection with Israel and the Jewish people.
