HADASSAH COLLEGE PRESIDENT AT BETH ISRAEL

Professor Nava Ben-Zvi, president of Hadassah College in Jerusalem will be our guest speaker at services Friday Night, January 20th. She will speak about the role of higher education in Israel, and its particular importance in Jerusalem. Professor Ben-Zvi points out that in an economically disadvantaged Jerusalem it is of critical importance for the diverse and multiethnic community with large numbers of children to be mainstreamed into fields where they can obtain the kind of education that will enable them to pursue employable careers. This is also true for "haredi" (ultra Orthodox) women.

KALLAH SCHOLAR PROGRAM

Rabbi Gerald Meister, who serves a congregation at the Ocean Parkway Jewish Center in Brooklyn, NY and is a lecturer in comparative Jewish-Christian theology will be Temple Beth Israel's Kallah Scholar on Friday, January 27 at 8 PM and on Saturday, January 28 at 10 AM. His topic will be "The Nature and History of Relations between the Vatican and Israel" and remaining problems in that relationship.

Rabbi Meister is truly a scholar who began his education in his native England and continued in the United States, where he studied diplomacy, international law, and in Israel where he completed his rabbinic and theological education. His studies included Latin, Greek and Arabic. He is fluent not only in English, but in Hebrew, Yiddish, German, French and Italian.

He directed the Inter-Religious Department of the World Zionist Organization and undertook many diplomatic assignments. He was present in Jerusalem for the signing of the protocols establishing relations between Israel and the Vatican and also participated in the establishment of Israel's diplomatic relations with Spain and the Vatican.

Rabbi Meister's appearance is sponsored by the Ruth and Gerard Daniel Kallah Scholar Fund.

FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY....

One of the themes that I have often spoken on is that of self discipline. Self discipline begins with the discipline with which our parents raise us. Hopefully, they help us begin to make the right choices in such a way that choosing rightly become part of our personalities.

Even if we possess a sense of self discipline, it may be insufficient to deal with life's problems if very few around us have little of that quality. Then, all self discipline does is cause us to react against those around us. It does not make for a very satisfactory way of life. That is one of the reasons for religion: Judaism or any other religion. Religion is a civilizing influence because it teaches self discipline. It is easy to see how the more traditional forms of Judaism teach self discipline: kashrut, Shabbat observance, and the special dietary restrictions during Pesach are paths to self discipline.

But the more liberal forms of religion, Jewish and non-Jewish; with their emphasis on abstract ethics have a much more difficult task, bereft as they often are of concrete paths and specific directions. Rabbi Eric Yoffie, president of the Union for Reform Judaism recently stated that Reform Judaism is "not very good at saying "no." Rabbi Yoffie was speaking specifically about teaching moral sexuality to Jewish teenagers. Because we have stressed individual autonomy so much, we have tended to ignore individual responsibility. We have said with most things: "it is up to you to make the right choice...what do you think you should do?"

The performance of the traditional mitzvot, on the other hand, gives children a positive way to discipline themselves. They learn standards and they learn to discipline themselves to meet those standards. This religious process, hopefully, carries over into life. Perhaps, we Reform Jews who are quick to eschew traditional observances in our own lives, might want to reconsider our attitude toward them...or begin thinking of some other positive, systematic way of teaching self discipline. Not only does the Jewish world need a society with more self control and self discipline; the entire world needs it.
