FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY....

The quiet of a Longboat/Sarasota summer tends to mask the reality of a world at war. Perhaps, that is an overstatement; after all,

we are not enmeshed in WW III. Yet, WW III may not be the kind of war we refer to when we speak of past World Wars. Countries the world over are deeply conscious of the terror war that is being fought on a global basis. Israel and the United States are the first countries we think of when we think of the "War on Terrorism," but many, many countries have also had to confront terrorism because they have been affected by it.

There are those who would make the argument that what we deem "terrorism" is merely another strategy or tactic to fight a war; that it is but a means toward an end. I totally reject that argument. The deliberate murder of persons who are totally uninvolved, who are to be murdered in order to incite fear in others is a morally bankrupt position. It can only be practiced by those who have no love for humanity in general, nor compassion for the innocent, in particular.

It is my prayer that the hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah will have ceased by the time you read this message. It is my hope that the framework for a durable cease fire and an enduring peace will have been created by those whose agenda is a real peace that the citizens of Lebanon and the citizens of Israel will once more be able to look across a peaceful border by day and go to sleep at night with the knowledge that they will awaken to peace in the morning.

As we approach our High Holy Days, the season of hope, the time of optimism, I pray that you and your families will be well. I pray that our family, our people in Israel will be safe, and that our world will see peace in the coming year.

Nancy joins me in wishing you all a "shanah tovah um'tukah...a good and sweet New Year.

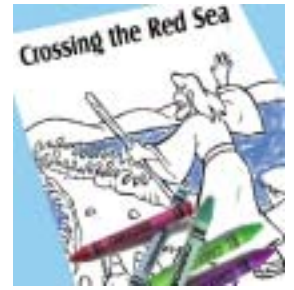
PASSOVER 2006

On a bright and sunny day in April, during the week of Passover 2006, Arnold and I stood on the deck of our cruise ship as we transited the world famous Suez Canal on the way to Port Said, located at the north end of the Canal. As our ship, the Regent "Voyager" slowly advanced through the Canal, the parched and arid Egyptian landscape unfolded before our eyes. We noticed the dry desert sand swirling all around us creating soft design on the banks of this awesome man made waterway. Tiny settlements appeared sporadically and the ever-present Egyptian donkey was always in our sight. We traveled in a convoy of twenty-eight ships. The first seven were U.S. warships; our ship was number eight in the parade and the remainder of the convoy was made up of cargo vessels and oil tankers. (Tourism is a vital part of the Egyptian economy, and since they have experienced terrorist activities in the past, great care is taken to protect all visitors. Therefore, when we were on land tours or going through the Suez Canal, our buses and our ship were always part of a convoy.) We were unable to find out why the U.S. Warships were in our convoy or where they were going, but they did give us a measure of comfort. Note: The Torah says that when we left Egypt (the first time) we were preceded by God's presence in the form of a pillar of cloud in the day and a pillar of fire at night. Perhaps this is one explanation of the U.S. warships being in our convoy?

Then it dawned on us! We were exiting Egypt at Passover, just as our ancestors did a long time ago. Even though we were on



a modern cruise ship, we felt a very strong connection to our *people* who shlepped and suffered for 40 years in the wilderness to throw off the yoke of Egyptian slavery and oppression. This link to our biblical ancestors was discussed and amplified at our ship's Seder by our visiting on-board Rabbi Dov Kentof and will certainly be recalled as a very emotional time for all of us. Arnold and I will always remember our Exodus from Egypt and our important connection to the Exodus of long ago.

**TEMPLE BETH ISRAEL LIBRARY
ONE OF OUR TEMPLE TREASURES**

In 1985 the late Joseph and Lily Laufer began acquiring books of Jewish interest for the library housed in the office of the Temple. Soon outgrowing the area the Temple expanded and a library was created. In 1992 **Miriam Miller**, a librarian, and a library committee of very capable and conscientious members began working for approximately four hours one day every week all year long. Books and audio visual materials are prepared for circulation. Today **Libby Adelman**, from the original group and the current committee of **Cecile Grodner, Marie Barr, Beverly Pascow, Ruth Engman, Fran Adelman, Carol Hallinger, Gabrielle Miller, and Beverly Peterman** have catalogued some 4600 books and shelved them for Temple members reading pleasure, research and to supplement the needs of the various Temple programs and activities.

Everything of Jewish content is found in the collection of books, video tapes, cassette tapes, audio books, Cds', newspapers and magazines. A vertical file of clippings from newspapers and periodicals is also used primarily by members who travel and members who need current information not yet put into book form.

The library is open on Monday, 9 am to 1 pm, Wednesday; 1 pm to 3 pm and on Friday Evenings before and after services. Only members of the Temple can charge out books. Reference materials can only be used in the library. The extensive collection can be accessed on the computer by author, title and subject in the library or through the Temple website.

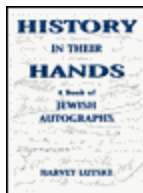
